Teachers and students are expected to be active participants in asynchronous and synchronous virtual learning. Teachers will provide students with opportunities that foster social engagement (discourse) through written assignments or synchronous sessions. Whether in an asynchronous or synchronous session, students should experience opportunities to interact with other students and their teacher on a daily basis. Through both virtual learning settings, students are able to learn technology skills in addition to subject-area knowledge. Additionally, students will learn how to manage their time and be accountable for their assignments. Attendance

Student Presence

- Attendance will be measured by the full day. Students are expected to participate in each class.

Student Absence

- Excused Absence the parent/guardian contacts the teacher to inform that the student is unable to participate in any activities for the day.
- Unexcused Absence

 - o The student has not checked in with the teacher.
 - o The student's parent/guardian does not contact the teacher.
